## **ABSTRACT**

Sensations and feelings: individuality and subjectivity. Machines will never have sensations and feelings. Mind: thinking, feeling and willing and the role of the physical brain. Consciousness and self-consciousness. Intelligence and the Turing Test. Electronic chess and Kurzweil's prophecies. New classifications of intelligence and "Artificial Intelligence". A.I: "Artificial Intelligence" or Automated Imbecility? Machine Learning: implementation, the new programming paradigm, social problems. Man-machine symbiosis and the "singularity".
